MESSAGE FROM DIRECTOR AYMEE LAURAIN



Far too often, negativity overshadows the accomplishments in life. I would like to take a moment to reflect on some of Florida's environmental successes in the past year. In 2024, thanks to mass efforts, citizens halted proposed

developments in nine state parks, ensuring the preservation of habitats and public lands. Conservation ballot measures in Clay, Lake, Martin, and Osceola counties passed, directing millions of dollars towards land acquisition and habitat restoration. The state dedicated \$8 million to coral reef restoration and protection efforts. The Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) conducted 995 life-saving rescues during emergency situations. Funding was secured for wildlife crossings to reduce vehicle collisions with endangered Florida panthers. FWC reported a record number of sea turtle nests on Florida beaches, particularly for the endangered Kemp's ridley sea turtle. Several

habitat restoration projects were completed, including mangrove and coral reef restoration. The commission enhanced manatee protection programs, including stricter regulations on boat speeds in manatee habitats and increased public awareness campaigns.

As we enter a new year, let's celebrate these remarkable achievements and continue to build on this momentum. While we recognize the challenges and fears faced by many in our community, it's crucial to also focus on the positive strides we're making in protecting our environment. By working together and supporting each other with compassion and empathy, we can create a future where both our natural world and all its people thrive.

SLOW MAMA

Slow Mama is a remarkable gopher tortoise who serves as an ambassador for Imagine Our Florida. Despite facing significant challenges, she embodies resilience and the importance of conservation efforts. Slow Mama's journey is one of survival and adaptation. She was hit by a car, resulting in spinal damage that left her unable to dig burrows. Due to her injuries, she cannot be released back into the wild. However, Slow Mama has found a purpose as an ambassador, educating the public about her species and the importance of protecting their habitats.

Gopher tortoises (*Gopherus* polyphemus) are native to the

southeastern United States and are known for their burrowing habits. These burrows provide shelter not only for the tortoises but also for over 350 other species, making gopher tortoises a keystone species.

One of the key lessons we can learn from gopher tortoises is the importance of resilience and adaptation. Despite facing numerous challenges, gopher tortoises continue to play a vital role in their ecosystems, supporting their community, enhancing diversity, improving ecosystem health, and maintaining an interconnectedness to nature, 2024 was a busy year for Slow Mama and we hope the new year she can share these lessons with many more.






